DIRECTIONS to the EATONTOWN LIBRARY:

<u>Parkway</u>: Ex.105 = Rte. 36 East – left (via jughandle onto Route 35 North) – right at 4th light (= Broad St. = Route 71) – the Library is on your left, before the Fire Station. Turn into the lot.

Route 18: Same as from the Parkway. The Exit is 13B (in both directions).

Route 35 North: Turn right at 4th light after the Route 36 crossing (=Broad or Route 71). The Library is on the left, before the Fire Station. Turn into the lot.

Route 35 South: Follow the jughandle (on right) to take a left onto Broad Street – find Library. If you reach the entrance of Fort Monmouth (on Route 35), you've gone too far – make a U-Turn – then follow 35 North instructions.

Route 195 East: Turn right on Route 18 or continue to Route 35 North - follow those directions.

If you come from NYC: Ask the Academy Bus Driver to stop at the above address.

As usual, we will have a **Featured Leader-Performer**(s). **Ingrid Heldt and Isis Ra**, the organizers, will also participate, and so can you: Similarly to the **Circle of Song Stage** at our **NJ Friends of Clearwater Festivals**, there will be **opportunities for audience members to take a turn or two to play – or to sing along** – please bring your instrument. But if you wish, just come and listen.

We encourage songs about the environment and sing-along songs, but you can do or request others.
